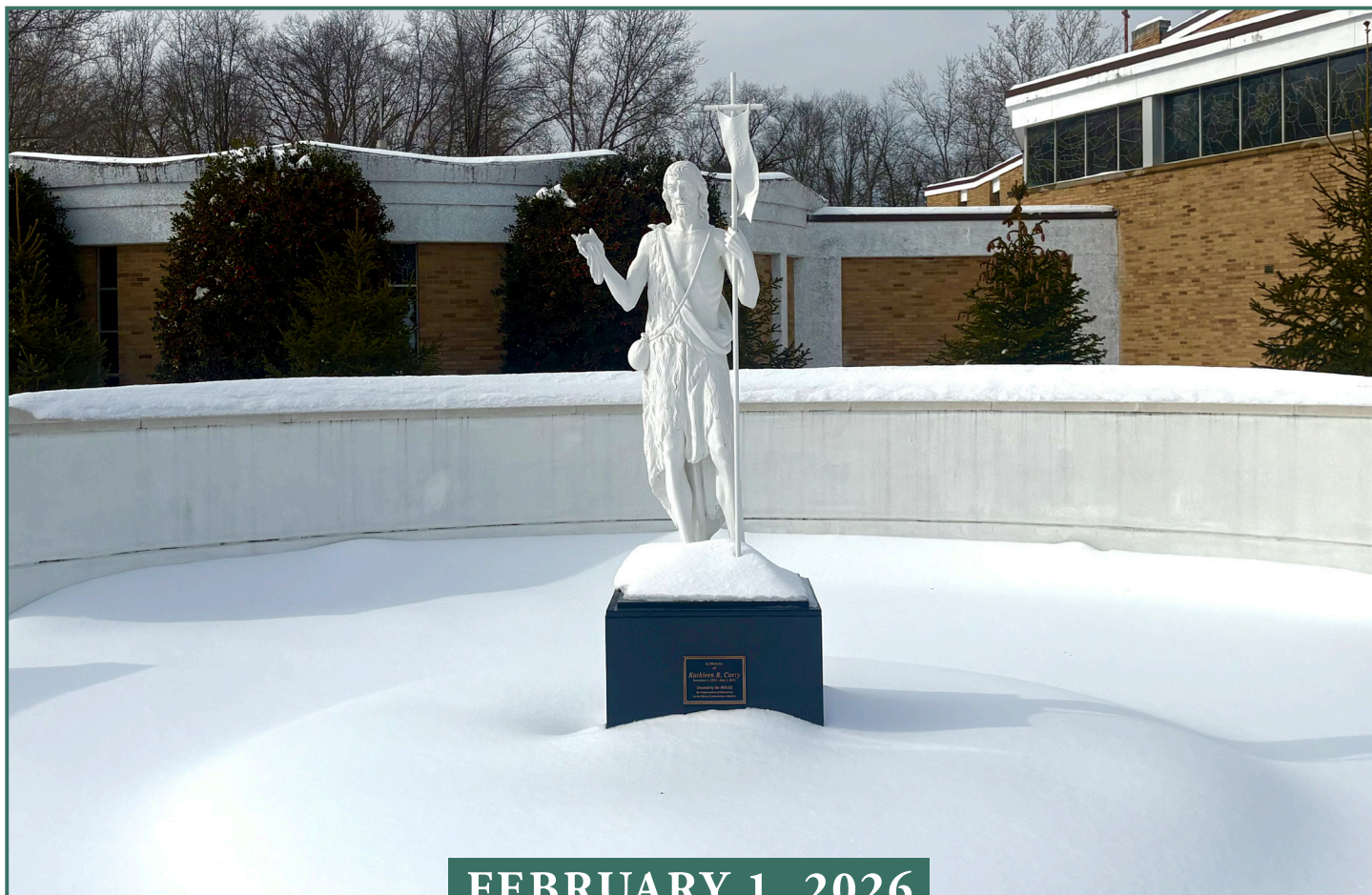

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Saint John the Baptist Parish Family,  
Dear Friends of our Parish,

Thank you for joining our family of faith in celebration of this Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. I am happy and grateful to the Lord that we together “survived” such a major snowstorm this past weekend, as well as this very cold weather. Over 400 of us gathered in our Spiritual Home (obviously most of us at the 5PM Mass on Saturday - over 340), and every one of the Masses was prayerful and filled with our community’s warmth.

The beautiful passage from the Fifth Chapter of Mark’s Gospel, which we know and cherish under a heartwarming title “The Beatitudes,” provides a fitting spiritual “background” for two special events of this past week: Catholic Schools Week and the beginning of the 2026 Annual Appeal. Both of these occasions certainly give us - as a family of the Lord’s disciples - an opportunity to live the Beatitudes in our own personal and spiritual lives, and, to be, in these modern and often challenging times, kind, generous, meek, merciful, loving, caring, clean of heart.

The Parish Community of Saint John the Baptist is proud of our Saint John’s Academy and grateful for the wonderful service of education, faith formation, spiritual and personal growth which the Academy continues to provide to our communities, our country and the entire world. We are profoundly grateful to all of you who have been and will continue to be - in any way - a part of this magical story of faith, education, love, dedication and Christian witness.

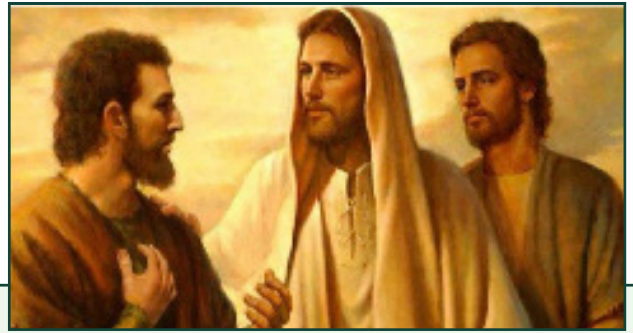

## WE ARE ONLY CHRISTIANS IF WE ENCOUNTER CHRIST

In the ancient Church Baptism was also called “illumination”, because this Sacrament gives light; it truly makes one see. In Paul what is pointed out theologically was also brought about physically: healed of his inner blindness, he sees clearly. Thus St Paul was not transformed by a thought but by an event, by the irresistible presence of the Risen One whom subsequently he would never be able to doubt, so powerful had been the evidence of the event, of this encounter.

Paul never spoke of this event in detail, I think because he presumed that everyone knew the essentials of his story: everyone knew that from being a persecutor he had been transformed into a fervent apostle of Christ. And this had not happened after his own reflection, but after a powerful event, an encounter with the Risen One. The clearest text found is in his narrative of what constitutes the centre of salvation history: the death and Resurrection of Jesus and his appearances to witnesses (cf. 1 Corinthians 15). In the words of the ancient tradition, which he too received from the Church of Jerusalem, he says that Jesus died on the Cross, was buried and after the Resurrection appeared risen first to Cephas, that is Peter, then to the Twelve, then to 500 brethren, most of whom were still alive at Paul’s time, then to James and then to all the Apostles. And to this account handed down by tradition he adds, “Last of all... he appeared also to me” (1 Corinthians 15: 8). Thus he makes it clear that this is the foundation of his apostolate and of his new life.

Turning now to ourselves, let us ask what this means for us. It means that for us too Christianity is not a new philosophy or a new morality. We are only Christians if we encounter Christ. Of course, he does not show himself to us in this overwhelming, luminous way, as he did to Paul to make him the Apostle to all peoples. But we too can encounter Christ in reading Sacred Scripture, in prayer, in the liturgical life of the Church. We can touch Christ’s Heart and feel him touching ours. Only in this personal relationship with Christ, only in this encounter with the Risen One do we truly become Christians.

# Our Seminarian Joseph Grabowski

## *My Journey with the Lord, Toward the Sacrament of Holy Orders*

A warm greeting of grace and peace to all my fellow parishioners at St. John the Baptist. As I start a new semester in my fourth year of priestly formation, I want to provide an update on how this year has gone so far and some of the milestones that I have made.

On October 5th, I was instituted to the Ministry of Acolyte. This ministry is a prerequisite to receiving Holy Orders and must be conferred by a bishop, in this case, newly appointed Auxiliary Bishop Bismark Chau. As an acolyte, I have a special responsibility to assist priests and deacons in carrying out their ministry and to act as a special minister of Holy Communion, especially to the sick and the shut-in. This ministry has been particularly advantageous as I have been ministering once a week at St. Joseph's University Medical Center in Paterson, NJ.



On November 23rd, I received the Rite of Admission to Candidacy for Holy Orders. This is the final step taken by a seminarian as he moves towards ordination. In this rite, Auxiliary Bishop Elias Lorenzo, O.S.B., formally recognized that the Archdiocese of Newark finds that I have a true vocation to the priesthood. In this liturgy, Bishop Lorenzo asked the Lord to pour out a special blessing upon me, and my fellow candidates, that we may be able to persevere in vocation and, “clinging to Christ the Priest with sincere charity, may be able to take up apostolic office worthily.”

It is still a little early to make any definite plans, but God-willing, it looks like I would receive ordination to the diaconate in May 2027 and to the priesthood in May 2028.

As we begin 2026 and quickly approach Lent beginning on February 18th, I am looking forward to remaining a visible presence at St. John's when my 18-credit schedule allows, and to once again serve at the Sacred Paschal Triduum and on Easter Sunday.

Thank you for your persistent prayers and support, they mean the world to me as I navigate this path toward priesthood. Please continue to pray for more vocations to the priesthood, permanent diaconate, and religious life. I promise you are in my prayers as well.

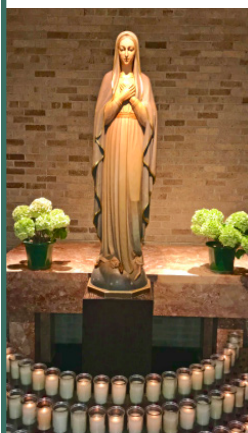
