Mass Intentions

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Saint John the Baptist Parish Family,
Dear Friends of our Parish,

During this special summer season of warm weather, vacations, travels, gatherings of family and friends, and all other activities which we all place into the “enjoying life” category of our lives, the Scripture passages of this 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time and their reference to the very last days might seem out of place. Reading them and listening to them create mixed emotions and an understandable response: “Yes, Lord, I know, one day, but not yet.”

“Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master’s return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants.”
(cf. Gospel - Lk 12:32-48)

While the “last days” appears to be that liturgical theme, our readings, prayers and songs today point our human and spiritual sight beyond eschatological concepts which could lead to unnecessary worries or personal concerns. The place of these words and readings right in the middle of the summer season, with some “special assistance” from the long days and a lot of summer sunshine, is quite symbolic. The words of our Lord, as always, serve to you and me as a constant reminder that during the most joy-filled, relaxing and peaceful moments of our lives, as well as during those difficult and turbulent ones, we should keep in mind that He is “the Alpha and the Omega, the one who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty” (Book of Revelation 1:5-8). Jesus never plants into our hearts and minds any sense of fear or anxiety. He continues to knock and invite us to a deeper life-giving friendship, never depriving us of our own free will or ability to say “yes” or “no,” in all different situations of our lives, however enjoyable or burdensome they might be. If we say yes, He truly becomes our Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end of our lives, the Master we constantly await. And, in those moments when we or any of our loved ones and friends say “no,” we can rest assured that He will never “give up” and will continue to knock on the doors of our hearts and minds in the hope that one day they will open.

Thank you for saying “yes” once again today. That commitment is precious every day of our lives, but it is particularly precious during those weekends when coming to Mass or joining this special community in prayer from wherever you are requires an extra effort or sacrifice, like during these beautiful, sunny, and often very hot days of Summer.

FIRST SACRAMENTS INFO

First Sacraments (Reconciliation & Eucharist) are celebrated in 2nd grade. This is a two year program which begins with enrollment in 1st grade of either the parish Children's Faith Formation or at St. John's Academy. In 2nd grade, there is a separate preparation program to which the family is invited to enroll. This is one program for all the children of the parish whether they are in CCD or St. John's Academy.

Registration forms will be emailed to parish families who have a child currently registered in 2nd grade CCD Program or St. John's Academy. Parent meeting is on Tues., October 4 at 12:30pm or 7:00pm in the parish center. If you have a child who has been baptized and is entering 2nd grade in September and he or she has completed one year of faith formation (either in Catholic school or a CCD program), you may register your child for First Sacraments. All Education in our Catholic Faith Must Nurture the Desire for Truth, Goodness and Beauty

In an age awash in information, often transmitted without wisdom or critical sense, the task of forming present and future generations of Catholic teachers and students remains as important as ever. As educators, you are called to nurture the desire for truth, goodness and beauty that lies in the heart of each individual, so that all may learn how to love life and be open to the fullness of life. This involves discerning innovative ways of uniting research with best practices so that teachers can serve the whole person in a process of integral human development. In short, this means forming the head, hands and heart together: preserving and enhancing the link between learning, doing and feeling in the noblest sense. In this way, you will be able to offer not only an excellent academic curriculum, but also a coherent vision of life inspired by the teachings of Christ.

In this sense, the Church's work of education aims not only "at developing the maturity of the human person... but is especially directed towards ensuring that those who have been baptized become daily more appreciative of the gift of faith which they have received" (Second Vatican Council's Declaration *Gravissimum Educationis*, 2). Our faith is a great grace that each of us must daily nurture and help others to nurture as well. In the light of faith, educators and students alike come to see each other as beloved children of the God who created us to be brothers and sisters in the one human family. On this basis, all education in our Catholic Faith commits us, among other things, to the building of a better world by teaching mutual coexistence, fraternal solidarity and peace.

At the same time, Catholic education is also evangelization: bearing witness to the joy of the Gospel and its power to renew our communities and provide hope and strength in facing the challenges of the present time. I trust that this study visit will inspire each of you to rededicate himself or herself with generous zeal to your vocation as educators, to your efforts to solidify the foundations of a more humane and solidary society, and thus the advancement of Christ's kingdom of truth, holiness, justice and peace.
