Dear Brothers and Sisters of Saint John the Baptist Parish Family Dear Friends of our Parish,

On this Fifth Sunday of Easter the love of Jesus and his personal relationship with each and every one of us continues to be the main spiritual theme of this blessed Season. The Gospel of this Sunday invites us to be those disciples of Jesus who remain connected to the true source of love, hope, and all blessings, the Redeemer, Jesus Christ (cf. Jn 15:1-8). He is the vine; we are the branches. "Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me," he is assuring us in today's Gospel.

In order for us to understand how personal and boundless the love of Christ truly is, a similar radical and humanly unexplainable story is presented to us in today's First Reading. The harshness of Saul's heart and his cruelties in persecuting the early followers of Jesus were so known among the apostles and in the early Christian communities that they had certainly placed Saul on the list of those helpless and "hopeless" situations. Then, even the apostles realized that the same boundless love of Christ which led them to their own personal conversions and friendship with Christ, was fully "in action" in the life of a confused and vicious man formerly known as Saul - now Saint Paul, another great saint of the Church.

Thank you to many of our parishioners and families who have already assisted us in our 2024 Register-Renew-Grow initiative and have re-registered as members of our parish with their current and updated personal information. Those who have not yet done so, I kindly ask you to find a moment today, or sometime this week, and re-register as members of our community of faith. You will find more information on the following page of our bulletin. Many of our parish records regarding our parishioners are outdated and we need to address this situation with urgency. In addition, together with all of you, we hope and desire to renew and grow our parish family, so that we can all be those "new life and new growth-bringing branches" always connected to our Lord and Savior, Jesus, and the Church which he has established. Thank you for your support and all your kindness, including the ongoing 2024 Annual Appeal, and the goodness of your hearts. I pray for each one of you, as well as for all your loved ones. And, as always, I humbly ask you to pray for me and for all those who serve and minister to you in our wonderful Parish Family.


I Am the Vine, You are the Branches Remain in Me, as I Remain in You

In the Gospel of this Fifth Sunday of Easter (Jn 15:1-8), the Lord presents himself as the true vine, and speaks of us as the branches that cannot live without being united to Him. And so He says: "I am the vine, you are the branches". There is no vine without branches. and vice versa. The branches are not self-sufficient, but depend totally on the vine, which is the source of their existence. Jesus insists on the verb "to remain". Before leaving this world and going to the Father, Jesus wants to reassure His disciples that they can continue to be united with Him. He says, "Remain in me, and I in you." This remaining is not a question of remaining passively, of "slumbering" in the Lord, letting oneself be lulled by life: no, no! It is not this. The remaining in Him, the remaining in Jesus that He proposes to us is remaining actively, and also reciprocally. Why? Because the branches without the vine can do nothing, they need sap to grow and to bear fruit; but the vine, too, needs the branches, since fruit does not grow on the tree trunk. It is a reciprocal need, it is a question of a reciprocal remaining so as to bear fruit. We remain in Jesus and Jesus remains in us.

First of all, we need Him. The Lord wants to say to us that before the observance of His commandments, before the beatitudes, before works of mercy, it is necessary to be united to Him, to remain in him. We cannot be good Christians if we do not remain in Jesus. With Him, instead, we can do everything (cf. Phil 4:13). With Him we can do everything. But even Jesus needs us, like the vine with the branches. Perhaps to say this seems audacious to us, and so we ask ourselves: in what sense does Jesus need us? He needs our witness. Like the branches the fruit we must give is the witness to our lives as Christians. After Jesus ascended to the Father, the task of the disciples - it is our task - is to continue to proclaim the Gospel in words and in deeds. And the disciples - we, Jesus' disciples - do so by bearing witness to His love: the fruit to be borne is love. Attached to Christ, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and in this way we can do good to our neighbor, we can do good to society, to the Church. The tree is known by its fruit. A truly Christian life bears witness to Christ.
