

Let us give thanks to the Father, who has made you fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light. He delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things he himself might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him.

I hope and pray that this Sunday as well as on the day of Thanksgiving we will all live, pray, gather, share, and celebrate with this spirit and faith-filled joy and conviction. Happy, healthy, and blessed Thanksgiving to all of you, our dear parishioners and friends, as well as to all your loved ones. Saint John the Baptist, pray for us. All you holy Saints of God, pray for us.
